

Public Letter to the ALP Candidate for Moreton

On March 14, a man with disability died while under the care of an unregistered NDIS provider in Acacia Ridge. The provider—Core and Capacity—was not required to report the death. There was no audit. No mandatory investigation.

Serious concerns about the provider were raised months earlier with both the NDIA and the sitting Member for Moreton—a senior figure in your party and someone you have worked closely with for many years. The complainant was told the matter could take months to process. As far as we know, the case was eventually closed with no meaningful follow-up.

This incident raises critical questions for our community:

- 1. Do you support mandatory registration for all NDIS providers receiving public funds?**
- 2. Will you commit to a public review into what happened in Acacia Ridge?**
- 3. Will you support reforms to prevent unregulated providers from receiving taxpayer dollars?**

These are not partisan questions—they are questions of public trust and basic safety.

You are not new to politics. With your background in law, union leadership, and party strategy, you understand how systems work—and the public expects clarity from someone with your experience.

The people of Moreton deserve answers. They deserve safety. And they deserve leadership that acts when the warning signs appear.

I've made my position clear in the policy statement released this week: *Fixing the Failure – Accountability in Disability Services*. I invite you to read it and to share your own plan with the public.

Leadership isn't silence. It's action.
